These domes are compatible with other ONVIF surveillance products, providing users with greater freedom in specifying a system and helping them save on future upgrades or migration costs.

Intelligently designed for easy camera specification, installation and system set-up, the new MIC Series 500 Classic is a rugged, high speed PTZ camera suitable for large, outdoor multi-camera applications like city centers, housing estates and industrial zones.
